A low more than 1000 miles east of the state generated surf of 8 to 12 feet along the east-facing shores of the Big Island of Hawaii. There were no reports of serious injuries or property damage.

A fire burned about 100 acres between Highway 19, Spencer Park, and the Mauna Kea Beach Hotel in leeward Kohala on the Big Island of Hawaii. The blaze caused no serious injuries or property damage, but fire officials did close Spencer Park on the 21st and 22nd as a precaution just in case the fire reignited. The cause of the blaze was unknown.

A wildfire scorched nearly 2000 acres in Kau District on the Big Island of Hawaii. Although most of the area burned was brush land, a state experimental agriculture station and fruit trees were damaged by the flames. No damage cost estimates were available, however. There were no serious injuries. Lightning was suspected as the cause of the fire.
