<p>A brush fire scorched about 220 acres of the Honouliuli Forest Reserve in west Oahu, 3 miles north/northwest of Waipahu near the Hawaii Country Club. The blaze had threatened rare native plants in the area. However, there was no significant damage to the vegetation, and no serious injuries or property damage. The cause of the fire was unknown.</p>

<p>A fire burned 60 acres of sugar cane just west of the Lihue Airport on the island of Kauai. A helicopter helping to fight the blaze crashed when its rotor hit a tree. The pilot was unhurt but the aircraft was a total loss. The cause of the fire was unknown, but it started in an area of discarded appliances at the Kauai County Lihue Transfer Station. The cane fire disrupted traffic to the airport for two hours as fire fighters worked to contain it. There were no significant injuries. The cost of property damages was not available.</p>

Heavy Rain

Also, the rainfall was severe enough to cause the evacuation of three homes in Kealahou, to flood 10 to 15 rooms at a middle school in Captain Cook, and to damage coffee plants at Greenwell Farm. Damage estimates were not available. No serious injuries were reported.
